

Annual Golf Tourney to Be Held in Memory Of Haviland, Former Captain of Team at Yale

NEW HAVEN, Conn., April 19.— Plans for an annual golf tournament in memory of the late Paul Haviland, captain of the Yale golf team in his senior year and an outstanding New England player for several years, were announced today. His classmates and other friends have pledged themselves to sponsor it and it will be played next June for the first time on the Yale course.

The date set is June 18, just after the annual commencement exercises at the university, and competition for the Paul Haviland medal will be open to members of the Eastern Intercollegiate Golf Association. There will be thirty-six holes of medal play. Funds for the tournament already have been partially raised by Haviland's friends.

Eight of the nine universities and colleges which compose the Eastern Intercollegiate Golf Association have accepted the invitation of the committee to send representatives to the tourney. They include: Harvard, Princeton, Brown, Dartmouth, Pennsylvania, Holy Cross, Williams and Yale. Georgetown, the other member of the association, has sent word that, because of a scheduled match with the University of Detroit on the day set for the tournament, it will not be represented this year.

It is already certain that George Dunlap of Princeton, intercollegiate champion; Phillips Finlay of Harvard and Tommy Aycok of Yale, all of whom have been prominent in intercollegiate golf the past two or three years, will compete this year.
