

YALE GOLFERS WIN COLLEGIATE TITLE

Take Team Crown, Holding Early Lead Against Harvard and Princeton Rallies.

WESTLAND CAPTURES MEDAL

Defeats Hisert After Tie for Individual Honors in Qualifying Round at Merion.

HAVERFORD, Pa., June 30.—Despite a magnificent rally by Harvard, Dartmouth and Princeton, the seven-point advantage held by Yale's champion golf team at the end of the third round of play was enough to carry it through to victory in the intercollegiate tournament over the Eastern course at Merion today.

Harvard was second and Princeton third. Yale's total was 1,295, Princeton had a total of 1,298, Harvard 1,297 and Dartmouth an even 1,300.

Jack Westland of the University of Washington and R. E. Hisert, University of Chicago, led the individual qualifying field with 150, but Westland won the medal with a par 36 against Hisert's 40 in the nine-hole playoff.

Fred Lamprecht of Tulane University, New Orleans, the champion who shot a neat 75 this morning, had hard luck this afternoon. Three times he found his drive buried and in virtually an unplayable position, and he was really lucky to get out of those tight places as easily as he did to finish with an 85 for a total of 160.

Harvard Springs Surprise.

Harvard sprung the big surprise when its team showed up with three scores below 80. This gave them a total of 978 for second place at the end of the third round with Princeton dropping to third with 979. Dartmouth was fourth with 982.

Westland of Washington shot a remarkable 74 to lead for the medal at the end of eighteen holes in the qualifying round for the individual championship. R. V. Cox of Union College had a 75. On the whole the scores were better than in either of yesterday's rounds.

Steady golf gave Westland his 74. He was out in 37 and back in the same figures. He started well with a pair of birdies and then had three par holes but wobbled at the sixth, and though he had another birdie at the seventh he was one stroke over par at the eighth hole. On the way home he had five pars and a birdie 2 at the thirteenth, which helped a lot.

Lamprecht really played better golf than the man whom he beat in the final for the title last year, except that he had a pair of bad holes where he took 6s and was one over par on two easy par 4 holes. On the way home he had a birdie 3 at the difficult eleventh, but took a 5 at the twelfth. Then he played the last six holes in one over par figures.

Robbins Sets Fast Pace.

Robbins, an early starter, shot a fast pace and had the next best score. Robbins has cut one stroke off his score each round. He started with a 79 yesterday morning, had a 78 in the afternoon and then came through with his 77 this morning. Three putts at the short eighth and again at the eighteenth proved costly, for otherwise he would have had a bad 75.

S. J. Besse Jr. and George Brush of Dartmouth both scored 78s, while W. K. Lanman, Yale, had 79 and Frank Wattles, the Eli ace, had an 80.

Cox of Union, who was playing around with E. S. Stimpson of Harvard, had scores of 83 and 81 yesterday. Today he had much better control of his iron shots, while his putter also was in an accommodating mood. He had five par holes in a row on his way out, got a birdie 3 at the sixth, was one over at the seventh with a 5 and then wound up with two pars for a 36, just equaling the official par for the first nine.

Headed homeward he skidded a bit and was not so sure on the greens, but managed to come back in 39 for his 75.
