

Miss Collett Studies Course From Plane; Afterward Breaks 80 for the First Time

PINEHURST, N. C., Feb. 3.—Glenna Collett added a new wrinkle to golf here today when she examined the new Pine Needles golf course from the air before playing her tournament match. The golf champion flew with Pilot Lloyd O. Yost, Miss Jane Burritt of Washington, D. C., and John Yale of New York in a silver Fairchild monoplane, and went back and forth several times over the 6,300-yard Donald J. Ross layout, which so far has proved

extremely difficult for the large field of women golfers playing in the women's mid-South open championship.

The success of the venture was shown when Glenna broke 80 this afternoon for the first time since playing Pine Needles, and won her match handily. It was the first time in three years that the golf champion has been in a plane.

"I wanted to see how to play the course from the air," said Glenna, and the golfers here are wondering whether or not she was joking.
